Q: How successful are organ transplant operations?

A: Receiving a transplant can literally save or dramatically improve a seriously ill person's quality of life. Advances in surgical skills and better drugs mean that a year after surgery 93% of kidneys in living donor transplants, 88% of kidneys from people who have died, 87% of organs in liver transplants and 85% of organs in heart transplants are still functioning well. These figures are improving all the time.
