## AKO's Tom Awad .386 Mark 'D' Pacer

Tom Awad, who had the distinction of hitting the only home run in the league this season, is the 1960 individual batting champion of the Mic Mac Class "D" Baseball League.

Whit Tucker, Awad's team-mate with the pennant winning A.K.O club, emerged as the loop's top pitcher.

Final batting and pitching statistics were released today by the Western Ontario Scorers' Association.

Awad topped the batting with 22 hits in 57 trips to the plate for a .386 mark. Tucker was the most effective pitcher with a perfect 3-0 record and a dazzling earned-run average of 0.37.

Doug Ferguson of Varsity Sports Centre was the loop's "workingest" pitcher with 11 decisions to his credit. Nine wins and two defeats. His E.R.A mark was a very respectable 0.89.
